Tone 7 Troparion (Resurrection)

By Thy Cross Thou didst destroy death. To the thief Thou didst open Paradise. For the Myrrhbearers Thou didst change weeping into joy, and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O Christ God, to proclaim that Thou art risen, granting the world great mercy.

Tone 1 Troparion (Feast)

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, Full of Grace! From thee shone the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God, enlightening those who sat in darkness. Rejoice and be glad, O righteous Elder, thou didst accept in thine arms the Redeemer of our souls, Who grants us the Resurrection!

Tone 7 Kontakion (Resurrection)

The dominion of death can no longer hold men captive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its powers. Hell is bound, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to those in faith; enter, you faithful, into the Resurrection!"

Tone 1 Kontakion (Feast)

By Thy Nativity Thou didst sanctify the Virgin's womb and didst bless Simeon's hands, O Christ God. Now Thou hast come and saved us through love. Grant peace to all Orthodox Christians, O only Lover of Man!

Tones 7 & 3 Prokeimena (Resurrection & Theotokos)

The Lord shall give strength to His people. The Lord shall bless His people with peace. Offer to the Lord, O you sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord! My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior.

Great Lent approaches

Sunday, March 2, we will celebrate Vespers with the Rite of Forgiveness following the Divine Liturgy. It is extremely important that you make the effort to attend this service, since we begin Great Lent the next day, Monday, March 3. The Lord is very clear in the Gospels that if we do not forgive our brothers and sisters, neither will our Father forgive us. The opportunity of Great Lent is that we "come to our senses" like the Prodigal and turn our entire lives back to Christ and the Light of His Resurrection. That opportunity presents itself firstly with the corporate act of forgiveness. More will be said about this as we draw closer to Great Lent. Lastly, if you wish to look ahead at the Lenten schedule, it is posted on our website under the link "Calendar." Simply choose the months of March & April, respectively.
